History of the 769th Chemical Depot Company (Aviation) November 1944 to September 1945

In the segregated US Army of WWII, all non-commissioned officers and other enlisted men in the 769th were Black. Most or all of the commissioned officers in the 769th were White.

During most of the time covered by these reports, the 769th Chemical Deport Company was stationed at Kharagpur Army Air Base in West Bengal, India, providing support for B-29 bombers of the Twentieth Air Force. On June 15, 1944, B-29's from Kharagpur and other bases in India had conducted "Operation Matterhorn," the first US bombing of the Japanese home islands since the Dolittle Raid. The complex operation required that B-29s make multiple flights over the Himalayan Mountains delivering fuel and bombs to forward bases in China from where the final leg of the attack was launched. Although Operation Matterhorn was completed before the arrival of the 769th Chemical Company, other B-29 raids from India continued against targets in Japan as well as against Japanese targets in occupied Singapore, Thailand, Burma and Formosa.

As a Chemical Depot Company, the 769th had the difficult and dangerous task of handling chemical bombs including mustard agent, phosgene and cyanogen chloride, as well as incendiary and smoke bombs. The chemical bombs were never used in combat, but provided an important deterrent against Japanese use of similar weapons. Incendiary bombs were used extensively. Smoke bombs were often used as markers, helping other bombers find their targets. By the end of March 1945, all B-29s had been moved from India to the Mariana Islands, from where they could more easily reach Japan.

The 769th remained in India until August 2, 1945, at least in part to deal with clearing the very large stockpile of chemical weapons which were no longer needed. Most US chemical munitions in India at the time were stored at Ondal Advanced Chemical Park, about 150 km north of Kharagpur. The 771st Chemical Depot Company at Ondal began preparing in April 1945 to ship a substantial portion of its chemical bombs to the port of Calcutta, where they were loaded onto ships and dumped into the Bay of Bengal. One particular type of mustard-filled bomb, 100-pound M47A2 bombs, often leaked and caused a great deal of difficulty for the 771st Company at Ondal. Captain Shaver and the Chemical and Incendiary Sections of the 769th travelled by convey from Kharagpur to Ondal, where they successfully removed the mustard agent from about 5000 M47A2 bombs, making them safe for transport.

Liquid mustard agent can cause serious injury to eyes, lungs and skin, and exposure can be fatal. The need to wear protective gear in hot and humid conditions added to the difficulty for both the 769th and 771st Chemical Companies. The total number of injuries which occurred is not clear, but chemical burns were not uncommon. Some enlisted men from both Companies were hospitalized.

During the month of February the organization was busily engaged in many duties. The organization suffered a loss in the t ansfer of 1st Lt Sherwood L. Hall to the 87th Air Service Group. Prior to Lt Hall's transfer, he was in charge of a detail hauling 4, 000 WP M 15 Grenades from APO 492 to ammunition dump, this Headquarters.

Capt John Kozar joined the organization on the 20 February 1945 in an attached status from XX Bomber Command. Captain Boyd F. Maurer Commanding Officer, was promoted to the Captaincy from 1st Lt on 25 February 1945, immediately placed Capt Kozar in charge of the Incendiary Section where his vast knowledge of CWS could readily be applied.

On 15 February the Chemical Section under the Command of Lt Woodrow W. Shaver, inspected M 47 mustard bombs for leaks, burying two at Chakulia, this trip was made in a Ml Truck.

The two (2) sections, Chemical and Incendiary, assembled 3,400 M47A2 Incendaries, shipped 700 M 18 aimable clusters, with the aid of the Security and Maintenance Section during the month of February.

To aid in the work at the ammunition yard, the organization received a Tractor Crane (M3) on 21 February 1945. Other organizational equipment received consisted of M3A2 Decontamination Truck, 12 February 1945, boxes 3 and 4 of second echelon maintenance set.

Capt Maurer and 1st Sergeant Thomas Shands, made a trip to Jamshedpur, India to purchase furniture for the unit Day Room, also an appropiation from Special Service of 400 Ruppees have been granted for the purchase of a radio.

The Headquarters Section performed the usual duties of administration while the Security and Maint mance Section under 1st Lt. Jack L. Wilt performed the following duties in additon to furnishing security details and kitchen police, made heating units for mess, grab chains for handling M 76 Incendiaries, grab beans for handling M 17 and 18 aimable clusters repair on buildings and day room furniture. The unit's motor pool and following shops are maintained and operated by this section, Welding, Carpenter, and Electrical.

To compensate the addition of one auto equipment mechanic, 014, and one crane operator, 065, the new T/O and E 5-418 dated 7 February 1945, makes a reduction of one auto equipment operator, 545, and one toxic gas handler, 786. The total strength of the unit remains the same. Seventy four enlisted men and four officers.

Inspections

- (a) In addition to regular scheduled inspections of personal, personal equipment, organisational equipment, mess and company area. Major Forrest G. Hoffmaster and Captain Woodrow W. Shaver made inspection 1 March 1945 of M17, 500 pound aisable cluster incendiaries at the 1903rd annunition dump and found lot number M4-1253-57 to have defective bands and clamps. - (a) On the 5 March 1945, the Chesical and Inc milary Sections with two El 6x6 Chemical Handling Trucks and four Chemic 1 Handling Trailers hauled a total of 166 M47A2 Inconditries to the line where moving pictures were taken by the 2nd Combat Camera Unit XX Bomber Command APO 495. A demonstration was conducted on the loading of a B 29 aircraft with these inconductes. (c) Major Forrest G. Hoffmaster and Captain Boyd F. Maurer with the Chemical Section traveled to a British Air Strip at Midnapor, India where they filled 20 Sky Markers with FS. A test run was made with a B 24 aircraft, dropping one FS Sky Marker from 5,000 feet and one from 10,000 feet. Good regults were obtained with the smoke trailing in a continuous streamer to the ground. It was noted the streamer remained in tact for approximately five minutes. These sky markers are purposely designed to mark a target.

Miscellancous

- (a) During the month of Earch 1945, this unit moved to a better area which affords more space and room to operate separately its mess, Prophylactic Station, Chapel, Day Hoom, NCO's Club, and Post Exchange. 
